## 1. Redhouse (Bexley)

Bitter | 4.2% | Erith (London)

Named after William Morris' house in Bexleyheath. A rich Ruby Bitter, with notes of soft fruits, Caramel and Toffee.

## 2. Mocha Stout (Bexley)

Stout | TBC% | Erith (London)

Special stout

## 3. Friars IPA (Canterbury Ales)

IPA | 4.3% | Canterbury

An intensely hoppy IPA. Making the most of Jester from West Kent & EKG from East Kent

## 4. Wife of Bath (Canterbury Ales)

Bitter | 3.9% | Canterbury

An American style crisp, spicy golden bitter with grapefruit and citrus hops and a long dry finish.

## 5. Garden of England (Craft Beer Man)

Pale Ale | 4% | Knockholt

Brewed using all Kentish ingredients. This easy drinking beer showcases the best of the Kentish hops Ernest and Bullion.

## 6. Bobbing Along (Craft Beer Man)

Bitter | 4.1% | Knockholt

Refreshing and traditional, it's perfect for those seeking an uncomplicated British beer

## 7. DB One (Dorking Brewery)

Bitter | 4.2% | Capel (Surrey)

The beer that started it all. Using 100% English Malt, with Bobek and Bramling Cross hops, this easy drinking best bitter is our tip of the hat to traditional British brewing.

## 8. Siris (Dorking Brewery)

Pale Ale | 4.2% | Capel (Surrey)

This Citrus Pale is brewed with lime and grapefruit zest, to evoke juicy flavours of margaritas and palomas. The Goddess Siris, sister to Ninkasi, was associated with all things beer in Mesopotamia

## 9. Stanza XPA (Dorking Brewery)

Pale Ale | 3.8% | Capel (Surrey)

Nelson Sauvin, Cascade, and a touch of Mosaic combine to evoke aromas of lychee, tropical fruit and white wine.

## 10. XPA (Five Points)

Pale Ale | 4% | Hackey (London)

A light and tropical extra pale ale with assertive hop bitterness and aromas of mango and passionfruit

## 11. Brick Field Brown (Five Points)

Brown Ale | 5.4% | Hackey (London)

A traditional English Brown Ale, with floral American hops. Malt-forward and robust, with flavours of demerara, smooth oak, and hazelnuts

## 12. Good Morning Captain (Fonthill)

Pale Ale | 3.9% | Tunbridge Wells

Light, bright, and brewed for long afternoons. Good Morning Captain is one of our most popular beers for a reason. It's easygoing, but full of flavour.

## 13. Creedence (Fonthill)

Pale Ale | 4.6% | Tunbridge Wells

Made with Crystal and Caragold malts for that rich amber hue and a touch of sweetness, this APA brings citrus zest and pine from the hops, balanced with a biscuity backbone.

## 14. Real Mild (Goachers)

Mild | 3.4% | Maidstone

True to style, full-flavoured with roasted black malts and chocolate notes.

## 15. Fine Light (Goachers)

Pale Ale | 3.7% | Maidstone

A balanced session ale with a floral hoppy character from the WGV & East Kent Golding hops. Our most popular brew!

## 16. Goodness Gracious Me (Goody)

IPA | 4.8% | Herne

India Pale Ale. Robust and citrus flavoured IPA evoking the taste of the Raj

## 17. Good Health (Goody)

Pale Ale | 3.6% | Herne

Golden ale with a fresh hoppy finish and undertone of zesty orange peel.

### 18. Scaramanga (Gun)

Pale Ale | 3.9% | Heathfield (East Sussex)

A refreshing extra pale session ale, brewed using Sussex spring water, extra pale malts and an indecent amount of zesty, floral, oh so delicious UK Goldings and Bramling Cross and US Chinook hops

### 19. Chummy Bluster (Gun)

Bitter | 4.4% | Heathfield (East Sussex)

Made with no fewer than 7 malts and 3 different English Hops, a gentle, fruity, well rounded ale

### 20. Sussex Best (Harvey's)

Bitter | 4% | Lewes (East Sussex)

A pale ale combining NZ motueka and UK hops to deliver citrus aromas and a subtly bitter finish.

### 21. Pells Pale (Harvey's)

Pale Ale | 3.7% | Lewes (East Sussex)

A cool golden summer ale. Very refreshing with a balanced complexity

### 22. Perry Street (Iron Pier)

Pale Ale | 3.7% | Gravesend

Brewed with Citra, Centennial and Simcoe. Light, crisp and fruity. This session pale is guaranteed to give you that citrus kick!

### 23. Burton Ale (Iron Pier)

Bitter | 4.2% | Gravesend

Malty 1940's heritage bitter packed with Goldings

### 24. Joined at the Hop (Iron Pier)

Pale Ale | 3.8% | Gravesend

Light crisp hop heavy with citrus pale ale.

### 25. Prohibition (Kent)

Pale Ale | 4.8% | West Malling

Highly hopped with some of the latest US hop varieties, this citrusy pale ale is a celebration of America's contribution to modern brewing

### 26. Maia (Kent)

IPA | 5% | West Malling

A full-flavoured IPA brewed with specially selected American hops for a balance of floral and citrus flavours that evoke a taste of Spring

### 27. Kicking Donkey (Lakedown)

Bitter | 4.2% | Burwash (East Sussex)

It's a proper best, using UK Pioneer, cascade and Jester along with local malts and yeast. We blend 7 of the best grains to make our Best Bitter, the best it can be.

### 28. Ace Face (Lakedown)

Pale Ale | 3.8% | Burwash (East Sussex)

A celebration of Cascade. Crisp, refreshing with a balanced bitterness and a hint of grapefruit.

### 29. Old Man (Long Man)

Old Ale | 4.3% | Polegate (East Sussex)

This original dark beer has soft malt notes of coffee and chocolate that combine with a pleasant light hoppiness to create a rich, full tasting Old Ale of times gone by

### 30. Long Blonde (Long Man)

Blonde | 3.8% | Polegate (East Sussex)

A light coloured golden pale ale with a distinctive hoppy aroma and a crisp, clean bitterness on the finish

### 31. Rollin' (Moot)

Stout | 4.1% | Upper Halling

Rich smooth and roasty, this traditional stout has notes of chocolate and coffee, a soft body from the flaked malted oats and hints of sweet caramel on the finish

### 32. Pilgrim (bitter) (Moot)

Bitter | 3.8% | Upper Halling

A malty, copper bitter with aromas of biscuit, caramel and pears. Dry hopped with Kentish Bullion for subtle blackcurrant notes.

### 33. Apparition (Pig & Porter)

Stout | 4.4% | Tunbridge Wells

Initially light, soft and silky, with a developing warmth and depth

### 34. Scarecrow (Pig and Porter)

IPA | 4% | Tunbridge Wells

A beautiful deep golden orange colour (and has great clarity) with delicious fruity aromas, with orange and mango at the forefront

### 35. Yes, No, Wait, Sorry! (Pig and Porter)

Bitter | 4% | Tunbridge Wells

A classic best bitter with a biscuity malt base and hints of toffee and dried fruit, complemented by the gentle earthy spice of Fuggles and the subtle berry notes of Bramling Cross

### 36. Castle Pale (Shivering Sands)

Pale Ale | 4.5% | Ramsgate

A crisp, sessionable pale ale. It frequently features local, hand-picked ingredients notably dried and green hops sourced directly from the Deal Hop Farm.

### 37. Searchlight IPA (Shivering Sands)

IPA | 4.2% | Ramsgate

Pine-like, spicy bouquet with robust citrus flavours with hints of grapefruit.

### 38. West Coast Pils (Stay Wild)

Pils | 4.9% | Shoreham

A hop-forward lager that bridges the gap between a crisp German Pilsner and a dank, citrusy West Coast IPA. It features a light, clean, malt base

### 39. Kolsch (Stay Wild)

Kolsch | 4.9% | Shoreham

A clean, crisp, delicate ale, with a light grainy Pilsner malt flavour and aroma. A lightly hopped

cask beer that is perfect for the lager drinkers who don't drink cask ale regularly.

#### 40. BEER FROM THE NELSON (TBC)

Beer tbc | ?% | (locality tbc)

Beer still to be confirmed: Generously donated by The Nelson Arms Tonbridge

#### 41. Best Bitter (Three Acre)

Bitter | 4% | Uckfield (East Sussex)

Expertly brewed to deliver a well balanced, bright and floral ale. We only use high quality traditional English hops & malts,

#### 42. Sussex Mild (Three Acre)

Mild | 3.3% | Uckfield (East Sussex)

Nutty and earthy flavours from premium barley malts, complimented by subtle notes of hedgerow berries from a lineup of all English hops

#### 43. Leveson Buck (Titsey)

IPA | 3.7% | Tatsfield (Surrey)

After hopping in the brew as normal, more hops are added as it ferments, tons more flavour but without the extra bitterness

#### 44. North Downs Gold (Titsey)

Blonde | 4.5% | Tatsfield (Surrey)

Light golden ale. Zesty

#### 45. Traditional (Tonbridge)

Bitter | 3.6% | East Peckham

This Session Bitter is packed with floral aroma and a medium creamy mouthfeel, followed by a long bitter finish

#### 46. Coppernob (Tonbridge)

Bitter | 3.8% | East Peckham

A medium dry, copper coloured ale with a biscuit and caramel maltiness

#### 47. Easy Street Pale (Tonbridge)

Pale Ale | 3.9% | East Peckham

Refreshing, golden pale ale hopped with Kent grown Ernest and Fuggles

#### 48. Blonde Ambition (Tonbridge)

Blonde | 4.2% | East Peckham

A fully flavoured, well bittered and refreshing blonde ale. Kent Challenger and First Gold hops provide a crisp, clean tasting, spicy and citrus finish

#### 49. Das Kolner (Tonbridge)

Kolsch | 4.3% | East Peckham

Kolsch (lagered ale). Light, fresh tasting blonde beer, with a slightly nutty taste

#### 50. Anchor Imperial (Wantsum)

Bitter | 4% | St Nicholas at Wade

A deep amber Best Bitter with smooth biscuit malts and a hoppy nose

#### 51. Spirit of Kent (Westerham)

Pale Ale | 4% | Westerham

Hopped with 9 Kent hops in a total of 9 separate additions. Most of the hops are picked and dried at the National Trust's only hop garden at Scotney Castle in Lamberhurst, Kent by hop grower Ian Strang. Ian is one of a dwindling number of noble hop growers left in Kent.

#### 52. British Bulldog (Westerham)

Bitter | 4.1% | Westerham

A full bodied best bitter in the Kentish Ale style, packed full of Kent hops to give this ale its distinctive aroma and satisfying flavour. Recultured yeast from the original Black Eagle Brewery recreates the flavours of Westerham Ales as they were enjoyed by Sir Winston Churchill
